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Nevada Statewide & Metro Area Labor Market Overview

In July 2023, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Nevada decreased by 0.1 percentage point and now sits at 5.3 percent. The unadjusted rate saw an increase, moving from 5.7 percent to 5.8 percent for an increase of 0.1 percentage points, this is likely due to changes in the seasonal staffing patterns of schools during the summer. The non-seasonally adjusted rate being up while the adjusted rate is down could be indicative of there being less of an increase in unemployment due to these seasonal factors than what is typical. According to the state's LAUS program, Nevada's labor force grew by 3,400, which was largely due to an increase in the number of employed individuals and a marginal change in the number of unemployed individuals. The state's labor force has grown by approximately 24,000, or 1.5 percentage points, over the last year. The state of Nevada has seen a month-over-month increase in its labor force for the past 8 months consecutively, dating back to December of 2022.

The Las Vegas MSA saw an increase equivalent to 1,700 jobs (or 0.2%) over the month. Meanwhile, the Reno MSA saw a decrease of 400 jobs (or -0.1%). Finally, the Carson City MSA saw no change in jobs.




Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

Figures for our unemployment estimates come from the Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS) program sponsored by the (<u>BLS</u>). Nevada's unemployment rate was 5.3 percent in July, decreased by 0.1 pp from 5.4 percent in June, and was unchanged from 5.3 percent in 2022, seasonally adjusted. The number of unemployed individuals increased by 36 from June for a current level of 84,738 people, which increased by 1,851 unemployed people since 2022. The labor force in Nevada is currently 1,586,028 people, which increased by 3,427 people from June, and increased by 23,935 people since 2022.




Unemployment Rate State Rankings (Prior Month's Data)

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, Nevada had the highest unemployment rate in the nation for the month of June 2023 at a figure of 5.4 percent. Trailing Nevada are California and Delaware at 4.6 percent and 4.2 percent, respectively.


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


Unemployment Insurance (Prior Month's Data)


Turning to our monthly data, in June 2023, 9,732 initial claims for unemployment insurance were filed in Nevada, a decrease of 129 claims, or 1.3 percent, from June 2023 when there were 9,861 claims. This figure is an increase from the 8,489 figure that was observed in May of 2022.




State of Nevada Unemployment Insurance Activity












Over-the-year claims activity for Nevada's regular program saw decreases across almost all measures in June. The number of weeks compensated decreased by 7,117, resulting in \$27.5 million in benefit payments, a decrease of 12.1 percentage points from May. First payments, however, totaled 5,328 in June, up 0.5 percentage points over the month. Final payments, also known as benefit exhaustions, decreased to 1,378, down 20 percentage points over the month.






The Trust Fund currently has an \$1.299 billion positive balance as of July 2023.


CES Summary Tables
